Sermon

In Lent, a short period of silence is kept following the sermon.

Nicene Creed *Spoken by all, standing.*

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of
the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten,
not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For
us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy
Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made human. For our
sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On
the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into
heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory
to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the
Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.**

**We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one
baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and
the life of the world to come. Amen.**

Prayers of the People *Remain standing or kneel.*

The prayer leader bids the prayers from the people. The call and response are:

Lord, in your mercy Hear our prayer.

The Presider offers a concluding collect and the people respond "Amen."

The Peace *All stand.*

The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

The Ministers and People greet one another with a sign of Christ's Peace.

Children return to the service at 9 a.m.
