ABOUT

The Trinity Choristers, founded in 2006, is a vibrant, renowned and richly rewarding musical program open to all children aged 8 to 18, regardless of religious affiliation. Combining the highest standards of musicianship and performance with leadership and teamwork, the choir welcomes new recruits at any stage of musical ability. Choristers learn musical skills and theory through the curriculum of the Royal School of Church Music.

WEEKLY SCHEDULE

Like any school sport, participation in the chorister program requires a significant commitment of time. The choristers maintain the following schedule from September through early June.

Tuesday OR Thursday

5:15 pm - 6:15 pm Rehearsal*

Wednesday

5:15 pm - 7:45 pm Choral Evensong, Dinner and Rehearsal

Sunday

8:30 - 11 am Rehearsal, Breakfast, and Holy Eucharist

This schedule creates flexibility for their many other activities and demands. New choristers, called "novices," are not expected on Wednesdays evening until they have learned the basics of music theory and singing. In addition, the choristers have other exciting events throughout the choir season. Many choristers say that the highlight of their year is choir camp each August, held at Camp Incarnation in Ivoryton, CT.

COSTS

Money should never present a barrier to joining the Trinity Choristers. Because we believe this opportunity should be available to every child, there are no fees to participate. Tuition for our annual choir camp and triennial tour can be defrayed by significant scholarship funds.

Choristers learn music theory, sight singing, and vocal skills that rival a music conservatory education.

AN OPPORTUNITY TO SEE THE WORLD

Every three years, the choristers undertake a tour to England to serve as choir-in-residence as British cathedrals, including St. Paul's Cathedral and Westminster Abbey.
