
Sunday, October 19, 2025

Based on the monastic offices of the Roman church, the English Book of Common Prayer combines the multiple hours of observance for the medieval monks into two: Matins and Evensong. At its simplest, Evensong marks the passing of another day.

Because Trinity's Evensong serves teaching and formational goals for our young choristers, the choir and officiant will lead most of the service. This worship booklet notes opportunities for the congregation's sung or spoken participation.

The service begins with a set of responses ("O Lord, open our lips; and our mouth shall show forth thy praise") and continues through a psalm; a set of canticles (the Magnificat and the Nunc Dimittis) and two short readings; further chanted responses; and prayers reflecting current events and concerns. We speak the scripture readings, the Lord's Prayer, and the General Thanksgiving.

The choir and congregation sing together the Office Hymn.

Join us for Evensong at 5:45 pm and then dinner and pumpkin painting in the Commons afterward. No tricks, only the treat of each others' company!



Anglicans in the Province of Massachusetts
Bay, the Boston Episcopal Charitable
Society's mission was to aid with financial resources
deserving members of the nascent Anglican
community who had fallen on hard times. Over the
past three centuries, its members' focus has shifted
from assisting fellow members, to assisting anyone in
need who is part of an Episcopal congregation within
the Diocese of Massachusetts.

Accumulated membership dues have been invested to create an endowment, which enables the Society to make grants through clergy to help individuals and families pay for basic needs, e.g., housing, heat and utilities, food and clothing, childcare, prescription medicine, and medical supplies.
